**How do we minister to people suffering from HIV & its stigma?
How can we be salt and light to a world facing this reality?**

A CDA in partnership with World Vision Development Foundation conducted a series of HIV and AIDS Awareness Workshops in April and June, 2011. The intention was not only to raise awareness but to encourage ACDA member organizations to bring the advocacy to their partner churches and communities.

Highlights of the workshop include the Biblical reflections on the guiding principles for Christian response to the HIV and AIDS pandemic. There was also a presentation on the HIV stages as well as issues regarding the initial reaction of people on situational presentations. Participants were able to assess their own reactions and experience; and compare their reactions on how the society reacts with this issue. *"HIV per se does not kill; it is the stigma that kills those who are living with HIV,"* advocate Ms. Malou Leonzon stated.

Did you know?

Out of 63 countries reporting data to the 2010 UNAIDS Global Report, the Philippines is one of seven countries with increasing HIV cases together with Armenia, Bangladesh, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan. All other countries report stable or decreasing infection rates.

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) infection rates in the Philippines have increased nearly five-fold between 2007 and 2010, from 342 newly reported infections in 2007 to 1,591 in 2010. Newly reported infections among young people 15 to 24 years of age, however, increased 10-fold over the same period (from 41 in 2007 to 489 in 2010).

Currently, about a third of all new infections occur in young people aged 15-24 years of age.

Half of the population in the country is younger than 21 years and at least 6.3% of teenagers (15-19 years old) have already begun child bearing. Overall prevalence of pre-marital sexual activity increased from 18 percent to 23 percent between 1994 and 2002.

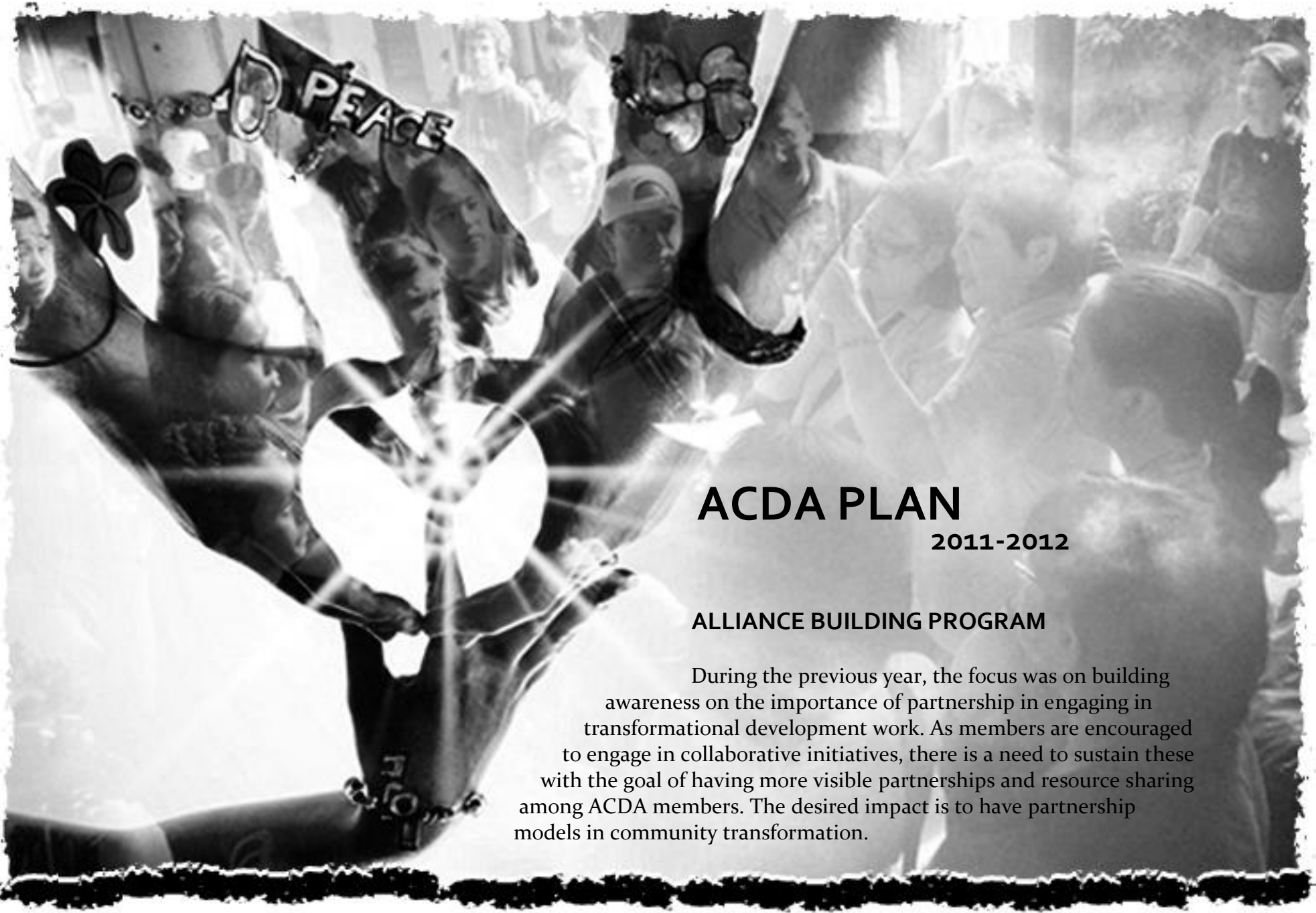

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

For the last six years, ACDA has been funded more than 60% by Baptist World Aid Australia. The remaining 40% are sourced from seminars, membership contributions and income from consultancies. ACDA has not been deliberate in integrating financial sustainability into the plan. Resource generation initiatives were also minimal. ACDA must now intensify fund generation through various means. This would entail strategic marketing of services as well as mobilizing members support.



Expected Outcomes:

- Effectively market ACDA services to members and other agencies;
- Generate support of members in promotions and marketing of ACDA programs, products and services, referrals to potential members and clients, and actual contribution of time and services to the network.
- Raise a total of Php 1 million for this year through various means.
